at Brif, Sin Bawie, on his Arrivelin the Bay, dationed Capt. Hever, with fome Ships, near the Entrance of the Harbour, wille Minfelf and the reft of his Squadron, kept at a greater Diffance, yet fo as to be within Call. Capt. Herver was fo extremely vigilant in his Station, that, though the French made feveral Attempts to get out, yet he always drove them back, and never infered any to pais him. While the Fleet lay in this Situation, an Occasion offered to infult the French in an extraordinary Manner. Sir Edward, on the News of the great Victory obtained by. Prince Fordisand in the Plains of Minden, on the First of Angust, where British Courage shone forth in all its Glory; made his whole Fleet stand in close to the Mouth of the Goulet of Bref-water, and faluted them with a Difcharge of at Guns from each Ship, as a Fas de

Joye. Mean while, Admiral Befersors kept as good a Look out in his Station off Toutes. Having continued there a Month, he began to, be in Wast of Water and Provisions ; to fupply which he went with his Fleet to Sale near Barcelona, and from which he went with his Fiert to Sale near Sections, and from thence to Gibral ar to refit, planting Cruiners in proper Sta-tions. M. de la Clas took this Opportunity of flipping out of Sales Harbour, and was: making the beft of his Way down the Streight, but being obferved by the Gibralter Frigate, im-mediate Notice was given to the Admiral, who inflantly purfeed, which the School for the section of the section this and on the 18th of Argent came up and engaged them.- His own Ship, the Namure foon loft her Mizon-maft, and both Top-fail-yards, upon which he fhifted into the Newerk.
