## LONDON.

Nov. 24. Purfuant to his la'e Majefly's Royal Pleafure, the Lords of the Adminalty ordered the Mariborough Man of War to carry to Bencoulin, Mr. Mafon, late Affiftant to Dr. Bradley, and Mr. Jeremiah Dixon, who were appointed by the Royal Society to take Cofervations at' that Place of the 'Tranfit of Venus, in June, 1761, and we learn, that Mr. Mafkulyne, F. R. S. and Mr. R. Waddington, of Hull, are appointed by the Royal Society to go to St. Helena for that Purpofe, and that they are to go in one of the Eaft- India Company Ships foon after Chriftmas.

Extract of a Letter from Lifbon, taken from the Cologn Gazette, Oct. 30.

" Yefterday Lord Kinnoul, the English Ambaffador, had his Audience of Leave of the King. His Majefty made his Lordfhip, in his private Quality of Earl of Kinnoul, a Prefent of a Diamond of great Value, in a Gold Snuff-box. To-morrow he embarks on board an English Man of War, to return to England. If this Minister was charged with any other Negotiation than that which he mentioned at his first Audience [the making Excufes for destroying de la Clue's Squadron within Gun-fhot of the Portuguefe Shores] it is an intire Secret to the Public. When the Gentlemen of the English Manufactory carried to him Complaints of Breaches of their Privileges, all the Anfwer they received was, that his Inftructions did not empower him to meddle in fuch Matters. At his Departure he acquainied them, that he had obtained favourable Anfwers from our Court with regard to the Exportation of Gold, and the Maintenance of the Privileges granted to the English Nation, but that he could not be more explicit with regard to the Particulars of those Answers, till he had first given an Account of them to the King his Mafler. Lord Kinnoul, during his Stay here, has always lixed on good Terms with the Count d'Oeyras (M. de Carvalho) and on his Reprefentations, the Court of London has ordered Admiral Saunders, who is flationed at Gibraltar, to fend a 60 Gun- fhip to Genoa, to bring to Lifton the Count d'Oeyras's Son, and his Nephew the Commander d'Almada. A new Board is erected to execute the Office of Treasurer and Pay. mafter of the Navy ; at the Head of which is M. de Mendoza, the Count d'Oeyras's Brother."

Now. 27. At a Common Council it is ordered, that the Thanks of the Court be given to Sir Thomas Citty, Knt. late Lord Mayor of this City, for his conflant Attendance in that high and important Office, and for his particular Attention to, and Encouragement of public G. 3d.

29. Laft Night the Speedwell Yacht (after fo much Time and Expence in fitting her for the Purpole of trying the Experiment of the Poffibility, not only of a Veffel's being made to move with confiderable Velocity in a flark Calm at Sea, but alfo againft a moderate Wind) was tried, by fetting out from the Red houfe in Chelfea-reach to Putney-bridge with the Tide, but againft the Wind, and tetprined back with the Wind, but a good Part of the Way againft the Tide ; which was performed to the full Satisfaction of every Perfon prefent, at the Rate of four Miles per Hour, which, in Cafe of a Calmat Sea, amounts to one thoufand Miles every eleven Days; and to prevent those dreadful, avil Confequences, which fo frequently happen, from the long Absence of the Mails from different Parts, may be of the utmost Utility to a commercial People, by preventing their Detainder in any Cafe, when the Winds are not very boifterous against them.

By an Extract of a Letter from Paris we learn, that the Court of France went into Mourning for his late Majefty King George, the 15th Ult. and continued it for three Days.
