It will be plain then, from what I have faid, that I by no Means infinuate, extreme Unction ought abfolutely to be reftored in every Christian Church, or recommended to, or enforced on all the Members of any. No! I only propofe that it be well confidered; whether the Use of it might not be permitted, where it was carneftly defired; particularly amongst the new French Subjects of our Crown, who have been used to it, and who will, I know, be fcarcely brought over to like the English Liturgy without it; and who yet by a Man, well acquainted with the Antiquities of the Church, and one of Temper and Moderation, might eafily, by fome finall Encouragement from the Government, be almost univerfally brought to the Ufe of it; I mean however, provided it were tranflated into the French Language, that for they might understand and be edified by it; and it is for their Sakes chiefly, that I have ventured to propose this Matter to the Confideration of those, who are the most proper Judges of it.
