

NEW MAYOR WILL BE NAMED TODAY

**Resignation of Mayor Geary
Will Be Received, and New
Chief Magistrate Will Be
Elected—Vacancy on Board
of Control Will Then Have to
Be Filled**

Today's council will have the spectacular feature even of accepting the resignation of one of its members and step into the comfortable shoes of the corporation counsel and of appointing another of its members to the position of mayor.

In accordance with the action of the last council meeting, the board of construction and the Housing and Welfare Commission will be asked to make a proposition before the council for consideration.

The commissioner of works' application for authority to appoint an accountant at a salary of \$3500 to be the head of a consolidated accounting and purchasing department will be before the council for consideration.

The approved petition for the Avenue Road street car line will be dealt with in the central district from Macpherson avenue to Cottesingham street will be considered.

Civic Car Lines.

Commissioner Harris' amended report on the equipment of the Gerrard street civic car line will be dealt with in the central district.

The reports to be before the council include the special committee on the establishment of a municipal station and a street car plant.

The bylaws on the order paper will include one to round the corners of the streets at St. and Montrose avenues to authorize the renumbering of the houses on the east side of Logan avenue from the present Nos. 547 to 589 to Nos. 589 to 547. The bylaw will delete the words "except that one child may be carried in an apparatus for the purpose of being taken to the coast" to be attached to each bicycle or tricycle."

Mustapha Pacha. The Turks were forced to fall back into Mustapha Pacha and this also they were soon compelled to desert. As they retreated they blew up the railway bridge over the River Maritza, cutting off communication with Adrianople.

GREEKS HURL ENEMY BACK.

ATHENS, Oct. 15.—(Cas. Press.)—The Greek army, under command of Crown Prince Constantine, after four hours' fighting today, dislodged the

Turks from strong positions commanding Elassona. Two battalions and two batteries crossed the Arta River into Epirus and occupied the heights of Grimbovo. Detachments of Cretans have arrived at Athens.

TURKS AMBUSHED AND ROUTED

VIENNA, Oct. 19.—(Can. Press.)—According to late advices, from Podgorizza, 2000 Turkish irregulars, who were proceeding from Plava to Berane to attempt to recapture that city, were ambushed by a strong detachment of Montenegrins. After a desperate fight, in which many of the irregulars were killed, and Sahli Bey, commander, and 280 of his men were captured, the irregulars were routed.

TURKS BOMBARD VARNA.

SOFIA, Oct. 19.—(Can. Press).—Three Turkish warships opened a bombardment off Varna today, directing the fire against two Bulgarian torpedo boats in the roadstead. The range was ten miles and the shots were ineffective. The Turkish ships then withdrew.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 19.—(Can. Press.)—The war office denies the Montenegrin reports of the capture of six Turkish battalions and a large quantity of munitions at Tushli. It admits, however, that Tushli has fallen.

Up to the present there has been no serious fighting on the Bulgarian frontier. Everywhere the Turkish forces are showing alertness and determination not to be caught napping.

MOUNTAINEERS TAKE UP ARMS.

SOFIA, Oct. 19.—(Can. Press.)—The noted Macedonian leader, Sandanulsky, it is reported from Dubnitsa, has assembled three thousand peasants of the mountainous district of Perim, near the Bulgarian border, and armed them with modern rifles. They will join the allied states against the Turks.

The Bulgarians have taken the Town of Mahomia, in the Razlog district, at the point of the bayonet.

BULGARIAN PRINCES TO THE FRONT.
