Notice to Consumers of Coal

Pursuant to Order-in-Council No. 664, the Fuel Administrators for the Province of Ontario hereby notify all consumers of coal, other than the owners or occupants of private residences or of buildings burning less than twenty (20) tons of coal annually, to obtain forthwith from the Fuel Commissioner of the municipality in which their respective buildings may be situated, copies of a form issued by the said Fuel Administrators, and to give the information therein required.

The said form shall be completed in duplicate, and both copies shall be delivered to the said Fuel Commissioner as soon as possible, but not later than the 10th day of December, 1918.

LEGAL QUERIES

A SUBSCRIBER, R. G. C.: Ques. 1.—Just what is meant by "probating a will"? Ans.—Proving the will in the surrogate court.

Ques. 2.—Must a will be probated within a certain length of time after the death of the person who made it? Ans.—No. Ques. 3.—Must a will be probated after the death of the person who made it? Ans.—No. Ques. 4.—Must a will be probated within a year after death, and after the expiration of the year the parties interested can compel the executor to probate the will.

Ques. 5.—Must all claims against an estate be advertised for when the will is probated, or is this only necessary when the property is to be divided at once? Ans.—Yes. Ques. 6.—Is a lawyer's fee fixed by law? Ans.—Yes. Ques. 7.—Can he charge anything he likes for such work? Ans.—No. Ques. 8.—What would be the least amount likely to be charged for an estate of about \$10,000? Ans.—\$40 if proceeding should be taken, and about

under \$10,000, and \$50 if over, not exceeding \$20,000.

A CONSTANT READER: Ques.—A party having the management of a piece of property allowed another party free use of considerable of the land for gardening purposes, also several extra lots to be worked on shares of half each in potatoes. When the potatoes were dug, which were of very good quality, the party who planted refused to share with the other party. What proceeding should be taken, and about

what quantity do you consider should be half share of each? Lot size, 30x115 feet. Ans.—See for damages for breach of contract or the recovery of one-half the potatoes. As to what would be a half share, the only way would be to measure the actual quantity in bags and then divide equally.

MRS. T. ANDERSON: Q.—If you have a mortgage on city property for the term of ten years, and the mortgage ran out last September, is it all right to not have it renewed until the present owner sells? The property has changed hands three times, the mortgage remaining the same.

A.—Yes; but be sure the property is still worth sufficient to pay your mortgage and the expenses of enforcing payment.

Thus one sees the life in the trenches; the charges of the French soldiers; the thrilling hand-to-hand conflicts and the thrust of bayonets; the murder of the shells; the great guns in action; the tanks; the attack by liquid fire; the charges and the retreats; the German pill-boxes; the flight of the villagers; the ruthless de-

struction of property; the treatment of young girls who fall into the hands of the Germans, and other things too numerous to mention, the whole culminating in the arrival of the American troops, of ultimate victory, and a hint of future happiness for those who have endured this terrible struggle. Mr. Griffith is anxious to have it understood that while "Hearts of the World" deals with war and love, it is a drama staged.

Prominent in the cast of "Hearts of the World" are the beautiful Gish sisters, Lillian and Dorothy; Robert Harron, George Fawcett, George Selman and other well-known players.
