

thousand pages of literature among the sailors and railway men; also in the homes of some of the poor families we visited.

Our Union did good work at the time of the municipal election. Several weeks before the election, all the women having votes in one District were canvassed by our members and asked to vote for the Temperance candidates. On election day our room was open from early in the morning until the polls closed at 5 p.m.; refreshments were served to any one working for the Temperance candidates. I think I may safely say, without fear of contradiction, that our work was as well planned and carried out as that of our opponents; and when the returns were made, we had the satisfaction of seeing the only Temperance candidate in our ward placed at the head of the polls—St. Andrew's Ward—one of the strongest whiskey wards in the city.

In closing my report, I must say this has not been one of the brightest years of our Union. Many of our members have been unable to work as much as usual, owing to sickness in their families, but we have been able to give some help towards lessening the drink traffic, and look forward to a bright and happy future for our Union next year.
