THE METHODIST BATTALION

To the Editor of the Halifax Echo: Sir--It is not generally known that Canada has given a purely denominational battalion to the war. Some time ago there appeared in a certain paper an intimation that the Methodist church was not contributing its share of men to the war. The matter was brought to the attention of the general superintendent, Rev. Dr. Chown, who at once issued an impassioned appeal to the whole body to measure up to their duty in this regard. When his appeal reached Winnipeg, the Methodist churches there offered to raise a battalion themselves. The offer was forwarded to Colonel Sam Hughes and was accepted. In an amazingly brief period the battalion was recruited to full strength and sent to camp for training. With the exception of a few friends, who pleaded to be admitted, it is a solid Methodist battalion. All the way from the honorary colonel, Rev. Dr. Chown, right on down the staff, they are Methodists. I had the pleasure of seeing them recently and recognized ministers, professors, students, lawyers, politicians and business men amongst the officers and privates. The battalion was called the pride of Winnipeg Methodism. At the training camp they were called by the expressive names of "Sky Pilots," "Hard Drys," and "No. 1 Hard." In the football and baseball games they stood first among the battalion. They carried off the first rank for rifle-firing and did not have a single misdeed during the whole period. This record makes one think of "Havelock's Saints," who could spend hours in a prayer meeting and go out and take the front ranks in his victorious army.
