CAILLAUX HINDERED IN FINANCIAL PLAN

Gets Delay to Finish Work For the Restoration of French Treasury.

PARIS, Oct. 20.—M. Caillaux is encountering difficulty in elaborating his plan for the financial restoration of the French treasury.

This he outlined to the cabinet today, but he requested some delay in order to complete his work. At his request the convening of parliament, which had been fixed for October 29, was postponed until October 31.

The finance minister explained that he and his assistants were still working on the projects for which France was waiting for. It is no secret in official circles that the French gold has been a disappointment. Subscriptions amounting to probably not more than seven billion francs were entered, whereas twice or three times that sum was expected. It was said in semi-official circles after the council today that one item of M. Caillaux's project calls for the issue of an additional ten billion francs paper money early in November.

STRONG MAN LIFTED BRICK; NEAR DEATH

Man Who Played With 1,000-Pound Weights, Beaten by Trifle.

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—(United News)—Selig Whitman once wound his mighty fingers around the bar of a 1,000-pound dumbbell and hoisted it over his head. Another time he pushed a freight car up an incline. Another time he lifted a brick.

And lifting this mere brick he strained himself so badly that he is now partly paralyzed and in danger of dying.

Whitman was a professional strong man when Weber and Fields were tickling the country's sense of humor with their guttural mirth. He toured with them, an added attraction of the show, and it was part of every night's work to toy with weights and dumbbells of 500 pounds or so.
