"I could do without it," said Tommy Tiltmouse sleepily. "I'd like to go home. The sun is coming up and we've been out all night."

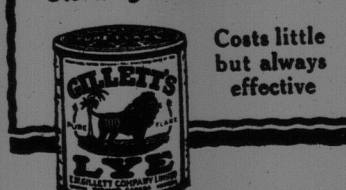
"All right, Tommy. Home, please!" said Johnny Jump Up.
