Delhi, India, March 22—The legislative assembly, by a vote of 68 to 30, yesterday declined to agree to the raising of the import duty on cotton from 11 to 15 per cent ad valorem. The reduction of the increase in the cotton entails a loss of 341 lakhs to the budget.


