

FIVE BOUTS AT ARMORY MEET

Johnny McIntyre, welterweight champion of the maritime provinces will complete his training here this afternoon for his bout on Tuesday night at the Armory with Howard McRae, a crack Bostonian heavy lightweight.

McIntyre's last bout was in Houlton on June 19 with Tommy Early and McIntyre won by a wide margin. Tommy Willis, a local welterweight, was in the semi-final to this bout, losing on a foul in the fourth round to Eddie McPartland after Willis had floored McPartland twice.

The referee contended that Willis hit McPartland before the Houlton boxer arose to his feet after being knocked down the second time, but the crowd jeered the verdict. McPartland announced he would box no more.

Willis will meet Young Dempsey of this city at the Armory tomorrow night for the third time. This will be the semi-final bout to the McIntyre and McRae contest. Jack Sullivan will box Young Keefe, Earl Penny and Bobby Mason will clash. Young O'Neill and Battling Martin will appear in another bout. The Willis and Dempsey bout is expected to be exciting.

NEW WAR ON COCAINE

Paris, July 24—An international organization for the control and prevention of the growing menace of cocaine is proposed by the French Academy of Medicine.

It is pointed out that large quantities of cocaine are being distributed to the world's markets by Germany, Central America and Mexico. Despite 600 arrests in France last year, the penalties have been insufficient to halt the traffic.

The French Academy of Medicine has appointed a commission to frame regulations and to consult the proper authorities in the United States and elsewhere.

POKKER CHOOSES CHICAGO.

Dutch Airplane Inventor Would Make That City Aviation Centre.

Chicago, July 24—A proposal to make Chicago the aviation transportation centre of the United States and Milwaukee, 100 miles north, on the shore of Lake Michigan, the airplane manufacturing centre of the country, was made by A. G. H. Fokker, Dutch airplane inventor, in a speech here before the Chicago Association of Commerce.

Fokker, whose planes were extensively used by the Germans in the war, owns the world's largest airplane factory. He will soon sail for Holland to arrange a transfer of his headquarters to America.

POLAND HAS GOOD CROPS.

She May Have 30,000 Cars of Produce For Export.

Warsaw, July 24—(By Associated Press)—Poland's crop outlook is exceptionally good, despite the cold spring, according to figures made public today. The area of cultivated land is greater by twenty-four per cent this year than last.

Poland is expected not only to be able to satisfy her own needs but to export between 20,000 and 30,000 carloads of produce. Whether her exportable crop will be nearer to the first or second figure will depend somewhat upon the potato crop, which at present is rather uncertain.
