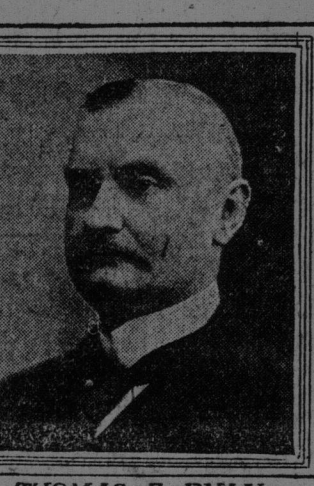

## THOMAS F. RYAN, FINANCIAL BACKER OF KING LEOPOLD. "STRIKES" DIAMOND MINE IN CONGO FREE STATE—SOUGHT RUBBER. BUT HE DISCOVERS BRILLIANTS.

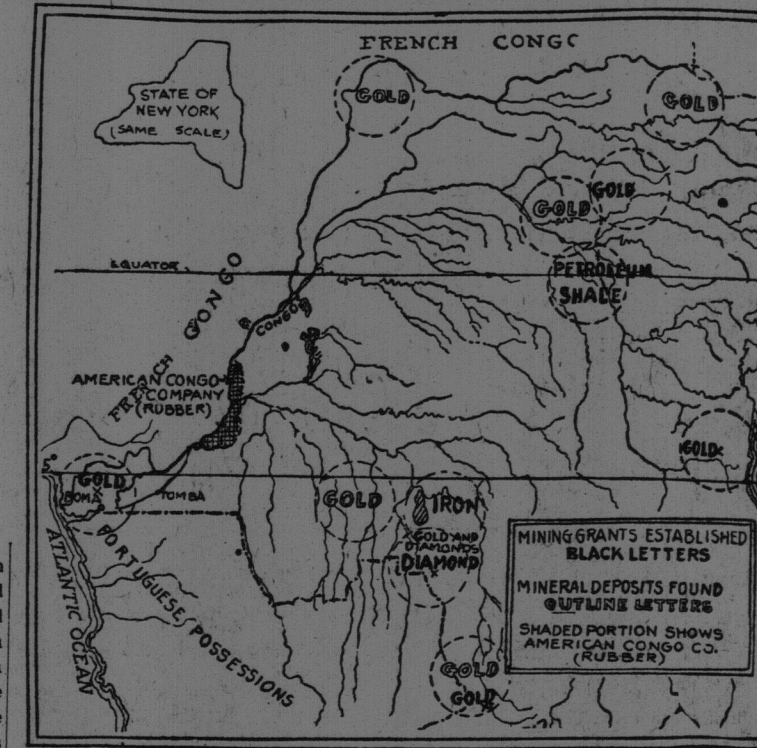

Thomas F. Ryan, the American financier, who a few years ago received a concession of millions of acres of land in the Congo Free State in return for a large sum of money in the form of a loan to King Leopold, has earned the new title of Diamond King. The African concession which Mr. Ryan has been prospecting for rubber has unexpectedly yielded diamonds in large numbers.

Two hundred and forty eight diamonds are in the New York Custom House and this week will be delivered to Mr. Ryan, the first and the last expected fruits of his loan of millions to King Leopold.

Mr. Ryan retired from the directorate

of twenty-six railroad and industrial corporations soon after he became partner of King Leopold in the Congo and long has been regarded as out of active business life.
