sleeping fit. An apothecary bled, blistered and applied a number of external irritants, but to no purpose.

He was artificially fed for ten weeks, when his jaws became set, and could not be opened even with instruments. He slept for seventeen weeks; then he suddenly awoke, dressed and walked about the room under the impression that he had slept for only one night. His next attack lasted from August 17 to November 19, 1697. He went off to sleep again almost immediately after waking, and did not wake up again until the beginning of the following February.

Very curious was the case of Simeon Watson, a hard-working, industrious man, aged about thirty, of athletic habits and active temperament, who about 1826 began preaching in his sleep. His trance or sleeping fit invariably lasted as long as the ordinary Non-conformist service, which he was in the habit of attending. The attacks became more frequent as time went on, and he would go through the whole of the ordinary chapel service, praying, reading the Bible, and preaching.
