MURDER CHARGE MAY BE RESULT

Divorce Action Revives Case of Baby Killed in Portland, Maine.

Portland, Me., June 11.—If a murder charge on which his girl wife bases her divorce plea can be substantiated, Kenneth Ross MacLean, former Bowdoin College athlete, will have to stand trial here for suffocating his infant daughter, whose paternity he was unwilling to acknowledge publicly while he was a student at Bowdoin.

Will Follow Case.

This was the declaration made by County Prosecutor Ralph M. Ingalls, when asked what he was going to do about a murder charge which MacLean's estranged wife had made in her libel for divorce, filed in the courts at Tacoma, Washington.

"If the evidence is forthcoming," said he, "I will present it to the grand jury and in case the grand jury reports an indictment, I will bring MacLean here for trial."

"In the meantime, I shall take immediate steps to get in touch with the participants in the divorce proceedings. I am prepared to go the whole journey in this case and will send a personal representative to Tacoma to investigate and hear the evidence."

"The grand jury failed to indict Mrs. MacLean in February. She assumed the blame for the child's death. This is the first intimation of her husband's being guilty. If there is any foundation in fact for the sensational charges which Mrs. MacLean is reported to have made against her husband in her divorce suit, whoever was responsible for the child's death will be brought here and prosecuted fully and completely."

Arrested in February.

MacLean and his wife attracted wide attention here last February when they were arrested following an attempt by the wife to have her baby buried from a local undertaking establishment. Mrs. MacLean at that time said in an alleged confession to Mrs. Roberts Reed, state agent for the protection of children, that she had smothered the child herself, following a quarrel with her husband.

She said that she and MacLean were

married in Tacoma in 1922 while they were attending high school together. A year later a baby girl was born. MacLean, who is the son of a wealthy merchant, the proprietor of a chain of

grocery stores, had come east to Bowdoin before the child was born. They had kept the marriage secret because MacLean's parents were opposed to the bride, who was a poor girl. She,

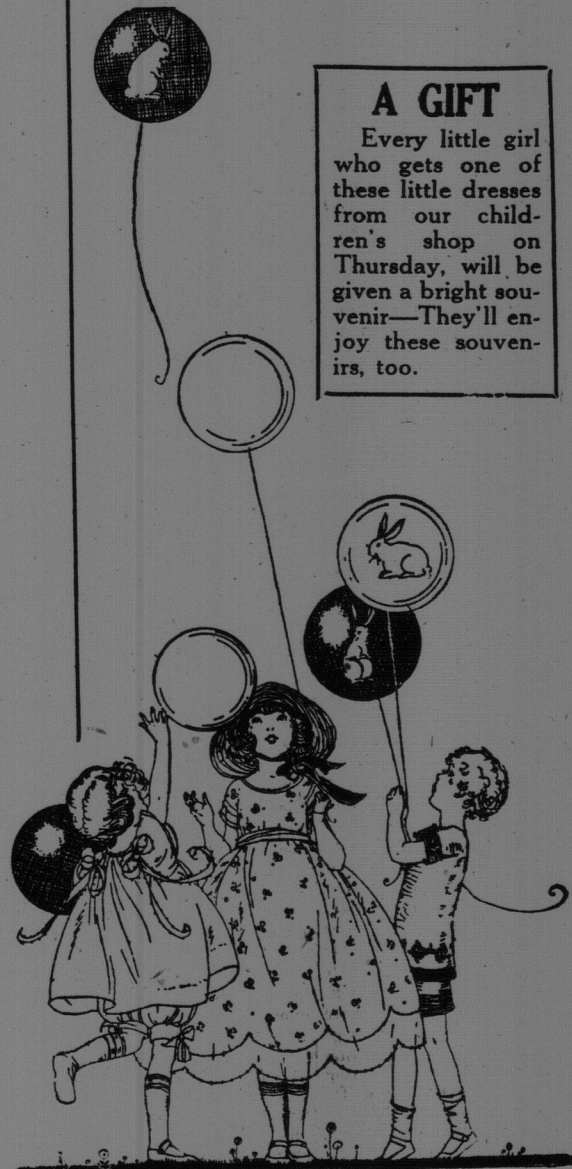

however, had told her parents and with their consent she came east in February with her baby to show it to her husband, who had never seen the child. She had made the journey at great personal sacrifice.

She arrived in Brunswick on Feb. 25 and secured a room at the Eagle Hotel, where MacLean called on her. He also called the next night, but before he left there was a stormy scene. The

next morning she said she became desperate over her plight. She had only about \$22 to take her home with her baby. He had told her not to speak to him in public and she did not know what to do.

Buried Babe in Snow.

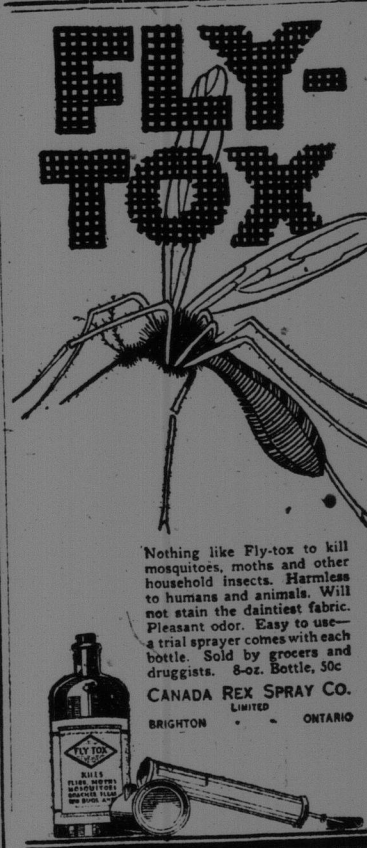
Beside herself with grief, she told Mrs. Reed that she went to the bed where her baby was sleeping and held a pillow over its mouth until it was dead. Then wrapping it up in a blanket, she took it to Mere Brook and dug a little grave for it in the snow, where she buried it and went away. But she was disturbed and came back and took the lifeless little body back to the hotel and then to the college campus, where she tried to see her husband. Falling in this, she took a trolley car and came to Portland, where she wandered about in a daze for several hours, finally stopping at Flaherty's undertaking establishment, where she requested burial for the child.

Owing to her mental condition, the police were called and she was taken into custody. Her statements resulted in the arrest of her student husband. Feeling ran high in Brunswick when the details of her story were told. MacLean, however, was not indicted, as the grand jury refused to indict his wife. Both were released and returned to Tacoma in the care of relatives.

Nothing more was heard from them until the report reached here from Tacoma that Mrs. MacLean, who is only 19 years old, had instituted divorce proceedings against her husband and a suit for alienation of affections against his wealthy parents.
