- Q. What was his appearance? A. No hat, his battle dress was undone and rather slovenly.
- Q. Did he appear to be drunk? A. No, but he had been drinking.
- Q. Where is the dividing line? A. If he couldn't help himself.
- Q. What conversation did you have with him? A. After I told him I had to detain him I asked him if he had any connection with a truck that had been found and he said he knew nothing about it.
- Q. What else did he say? A. He said "I have been on one Court Martial and I suppose I will be on another one, but it is a lot of fun".
- Q. Then what did you do? A. I stayed with him until 4.15, when the escort arrived.
- Q. Who was the escort? A. Lieut. Maw.
- Q. Do you think that when you inquired about the vehicle from Lieut. Knox, he thought it was his own?

 A. I asked him if he knew anything about a vehicle reported
- missing from his particular unit.

Cross- Examination by the Defence

- Q. You said that Lieut. Knox was slovenly, why was that? A. He had no hat, his hair was all over the place and his battle dress was undone.
- Q. You had a conversation with him, what did you talk about? A. It was with reference to the vehicle reported missing.
- A. No, only what his remarks were when I told him I had to detain him.
- Q. Have you that record here? A. It is in my report and summary of evidence.
- Q. You gave evidence at a previous proceedings known as a summary of evidence. At that time did you have with you any record you had made that night? A. No, only a copy of my report.
- Q. That was a copy of the report you made to the D.A.P.M.? A. Yes.

Questions by the Court

- Q. You kep the record of the conversation in your record known as the Occurrence Book?
- A. Yes.
- Q. When did you make that record? A. While I was waiting for the escort.
- Q. You then made a report for the D.A.P.M? A. Yes.

- Q. When was that? A. Later on the same morning.
- Q. When you made that report to what book did you refer?

A. I didn't refer to anything. I didn't take any statement.
