ROWDISM IN TORONTO.

A CROWD OF BOUGHY ABASCUT THE PROSECUTOR ACCOMPANYING ARCHBISHOP WALSH.

The venerable Archbishop Walsh passed up Church street last night. Some hooligans were included in the mob, and near the Roman Catholic church a stone erected the carriage and struck the venerable Archbishop on the wrist.

Some of the papers scarcely noticed the affair, but the Empire refers to it bitterly as a disgrace to the city, and condemns by the vast majority of its editors, adding: "We have no doubt the hooligans who have been guilty of this act, their conduct showing them to be simply champions of socialism."

HOW DO THEY STAND?

A case submitted to the Court of Chancery in connection with the Separate School Legislation.

Toronto, Nov. 28.—The Minister of Education has prepared and submitted the judges of the Court of Chancery a legal case for their decision, to conclude the exact meaning of some of the separate school legislation. This action is taken to the contention that the status of the Roman Catholic rate payer has been altered by Mowat's amendments to the law, making him prima facie a supporter of separate instead of public schools.

Terrible Explosion Explodes in

St. Peterburg, Nov. 28.—A terrible explosion occurred last night in the Konstantin Petrovitch pit at Borchna. Fourteen workmen were instantly killed and four others seriously injured. The bodies of the dead are horribly mangled. The explosion was caused by the lights coming in contact with the gases from the pit.
