Resolved,—In the case of Bowmanville District, that inasmuch as the ministers of said District who have failed to raise their amounts have pledged themselves to see it paid to the General Treasurer (the Tyrone and Hampton Circuits), be credited with the full amount; and that the deficits on the Uxbridge District be referred back to said District for adjustment, with a recommendation that arrangements be made with the General Treasurer for its settlement as speedily as possible; and further, if satisfactory evidence reaches the Secretary of the payment of any or all of the fields in time for publication in the Minutes, they be credited with the same.
