Lachandere acquired his title from his wife's coheirs of the Estate Peter Montour (the latter not to be confounded with his namesake bearing the soubriquet of Grey Horse) This Montour took hold of the property and improved the same which according to the Indian custom of old became his real and valid title.

In a word, Meloch had never any right to the holding in dispute which belongs, after long and tedious proof made, to James Lachandere and Peter Parguis.
