SIGHTED BY THE LILLIAN. The problem was then to keep the head of the boat to the seas and pre-vent her being filled. Large quantities of water were shipped, and while some rowed others bailed with buckets, and y this means the boat was kept com aratively free until the wind shifted of the southwest the latter part of

All day Tuesday the men on the vessel had scarcely a bite to eat, and when the shift in the wind came Wednesday afternoon they were exhausted ed more from thirst than hunger.
Wednesday night and all day Thurs day was calm and the sea smooth. Seeing no friendly sail they resolved to make land, each man taking his turn at the oars. They rowed all day Thursday but sighted no vessel of any kind. Thursday night they kept watch and slept by relays.

Friday morning came and down on the horizon they descried a sail. A vest was attached to a boat hook in the oar and waved from the bow the boat. Fortunately, somebody on the Lillian, bound from Quero, dis-cerned them and the fishermen bore lown on the overjoyed men.
