



## FEW IDLE HANDS

Which They Cannot Find.

BERLIN, Feb. 4.—Herr Gustavis for the official statistics of unemployment in Germany during December, 1909, covering all trades and industries, skilled and unskilled, in all parts of the country, reveals 0 7 of unemployed.

Employers in almost all branches of industry are claimoring for workmen whom they cannot find. Although the German policy, as shown yesterday, is anti-alien, many thousand of Poles and other Slavs are allowed to remain in Westphalia and the Rhenish provinces because there are insufficient German colliers to work the coal mines.

The fictitious figures of alleged unemployment, published in the Radical organs and propagated by Radical speakers on English platforms, are derided mostly from the returns of trade unionists who deliberately faisify the figures relating to unemployment to serve their own political reads.

These utterly misleading statistics, restings on no solid basis whatever, are selzed on eagerly by British free traders to demonstrate Germany's terrible condition.

An instance of this kind has just occurred at Halle, where Socialist trade unions petitioned the town council to the ground.
