Advice from Washington Territory received by the wife of Adam Kennedy of Upper Stewiack, Colchester County, give an account of his fearful death two weeks ago. The unfortunate man went west a little more than a year ago, and was employed at lumbering. A "shoot" through which the lumber was run down a mountain side had got out of repair. It was nearly half a mile long, and the decline was twelve hundred feet. Kennedy and another were near the bottom engaged in repairing it, when, by some means a slab was started down the incline. It came with fearful rapidity, without warning, and killed both men. The head of one was completely severed from his body, and the other when found had a large hole torn through his body, at the breast, the slab having passed clean through, continuing on its way down the mountain side.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN. Thos. Webster, the artist, is dead. The Marquis of Salisbury has gone to France. The old firm of Ravetina, at Havre, 175, has failed, with liabilities of £190,000. The Bulgarian government is negotiating with French firms for a loan of £200,000. Since the outbreak of the cholera epidemic in Italy there have been 40,000 cases and 14,000 deaths from the disease throughout the country.

A yacht propelled by electricity crossed from Dover to Calis in 24 hours. More gold has been discovered in the Transvaal, South Africa. A valuable coal seam has been discovered close by the city of Glasgow, Scotland. Out of a population of 1,300,000 in Berlin more than 150,000 are receiving public charity. The British war scare, of 1885, cost the English Government £1,117,000 for hiring of transports which were never used. For the Americas they paid £66,000, the Umbria, £45,000; and the Rosetta, £23,000. Electric lights have been introduced on railroad trains in Germany. It is said that from 3,000 to 4,000 horses are killed in Spain yearly in bull fighting. A despatch from Essen announces that an explosion of fire-damp occurred in the coal pit near Sahalke on the 8th, and 45 persons were killed and 15 injured, eight of the latter being in a precarious condition.

The Severn Tunnel, which has been thirteen years in construction, and has cost over £2,000,000, was opened a fortnight ago for goods traffic. It is nearly four and a half miles in length, of which two and a quarter are beneath an arm of the sea. In the construction 75,000,000 bricks have been used. The principal commercial languages of the world are: Russian, spoken by 100,000,000 people; Russian, by 60,000,000; German, by 50,000,000; Spanish, by 60,000,000; French, by 40,000,000; and Italian, by 25,000,000.

UNITED STATES. It is reported that the President intends proposing to Congress the appointment of a commission to consider the whole fishery question. The business failures occurring throughout the country during the past few days, as reported by E. G. Dunn & Co., and E. Russell & Co., of the mercantile agency, by telegraph, number for the United States 166, and for Canada 23, of a total of 187, as against 185 last year. A 14 year old daughter of David Fry, of Stumptown, Md., was ill and slept 68 hours. She awoke, sat heartily, seemed quite well and then went to sleep again. At last accounts she had been sleeping 98 hours continuing. Charles Doll, president, and Major James Morgan, secretary, of the late Board of Public Works, Cincinnati; Charles T. Blackburn, clerk, and Geo. F. Selter, assistant clerk, have been arrested for embezzling the city's funds. The amounts vary in different cases, but the highest aggregate is over \$100,000. Boston is to enjoy its first cattle show and fair in thirty years, Oct. 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, in the great Mechanics' Building. Fully \$15,000 in premiums are offered. The affair will be looked forward to with interest and no doubt prove the reigning event of the cattle fair and shows now closing. The Bay State Agricultural Society will have charge of the fair.
