

Czar Has a Birthday And Looks Well on It

St. Petersburg, May 18.—The customary official observances today marked the forty-third birthday anniversary of the Czar. During the day the foreign diplomats presented messages of congratulation in behalf of their respective rulers and governments.

OUR LETTER FROM PARIS American Art Colony in French Capital is Rapidly Growing—Portugal's Elections Set for May 28th.

Paris, May 4.—Some years ago this bault Blason, an eminent French art critic wrote that the American painters who had come to Paris to learn would stay to teach. The prophecy has been fulfilled.

Ten years ago the American art colony was of moderate proportions; now it is not only far outnumbered but of other nationality but has developed into a school of painting, the leaders of which are such men as Prisseke, Richard Miller, H. O. Tanner, Myron Barlow, Lionel Walden and Chauncey Ryder.

Every year, drawn by the growing renown of these painters, an increasing number of art students land from America. The young masters mentioned above are besieged with applications for tuition, and the big French academies such as Julian's are becoming alarmed at the diversion of what was once a most profitable stream.

The Montparnasse quarter, the art center of the south bank of the Seine, once the cheapest quarter in Paris, is now becoming one of the most expensive, for it is here that all the American students pick their tents; one street, the Rue Boissnadre, is barely a French residence, and is popularly known as "Little America."

Women take a prominent part in the exponents of the new school. Elizabeth Nourse and Beatrice Howe are probably the best women painters in France. They this year received distinction that a foreigner can receive, and their pictures are to be seen in prominent positions at the principal exhibitions in Paris and the provinces.

The work of the new school is quite distinctive, resembling neither that of eminent French painters nor that of the home American artists. Its principal characteristic is its eminently decorative quality, combined with graceful composition and rich and harmonious color equally distant from the coldness of Whistler and the blaziness of the advanced impressionists.

The brilliant success of the Italian season of opera in Paris last spring when the Metropolitan Company from New York brought crowded houses to the Chatelet theatre has led to other theatrical enterprises for the season. The "Societe Musicale" of which G. Astruc is director, has begun a programme of Russian dancing at the Chatelet. This will be followed by a Beethoven festival, and a live English musical comedy, "The Quaker Girl." Astruc and George Edwards express the opinion that there is a great future for American and English musical comedy in Paris.

The political eyes of Europe will be turning soon upon Portugal where the elections for the Constituent Assembly have been fixed for May 28. Thus far the young republic has weathered the more or less serious conspiracies to restore young Manuel to his throne and the dangers of partisan strife. The elections are looked forward to as a test of the republic's power of endurance.

Senhor Joao Chagas, who has just been appointed Portuguese minister to France, is entering upon the future glories of his country, and sends this message to America: "We are confident that once the Constituent Assembly is in working order the greater powers will follow the example of Brazil and the Argentine republic in giving official recognition to the republic of Portugal. We trust that America will be among the first, for in that country we feel that there is a peculiar sympathy for us in our efforts for a greater and truer Portugal."

Senhor Chagas considers it idle to discuss the possibility of the restoration of the crown. "Any move in that direction," he says, "would be serious but only in the sense that it would be fatal for those who attempted it. Let the world be assured that the great masses of the Portuguese people have done forever with the monarchy, and among the Republicans there are no dangerous splitters are too wise to destroy their own creation by stupid party quarrels. You have in America, in New England particularly, a large Portuguese colony. Our reports from there are excellent; I mean of the spirit of their progress as good citizens, their intense love for education and their growing interest in the national life. That illustrates the whole question for us at present. It indicates the natural drift of the Portuguese to the republic, and the drift of the Portuguese towards a democratic form of government in which all may have a voice.

The new nation has already made more progress in a few months than the old regime could have accomplished in a century. Among the laws promulgated are those affecting the separation of Church and State, the responsibility for paternity, the civil status, obligatory military service, the suppression of the religious orders and the secularization of education. It is well recognized that the monarchy appreciably compromised the country's finances. The republic is endeavoring to reconstitute itself by scrupulous and intelligent management. The interest on the external debt will be promptly paid. There is no intention to have recourse to frequent loans to emerge temporarily from difficulties.
