

The votes which have arrived up to and including the final press-day of the issue of THE DIGEST for May 1st, include 25,000 received in the first week, 125,000 in the second, and considerably over 300,000 in the third. The next two weeks' return, it may safely be prophesied, will place the poll's total beyond the million mark. The results are being tabulated and shown in THE LITERARY DIGEST week by week.
