It is as follows: Pope Pius IX. to the most illustrious and mighty Emperor greeting: "By the kind letter of your Majesty we have received a communication such as of itself elicits our congratulations, as well on account of the supreme dignity offered your Majesty as by reason of the general unanimity with which the Princes and free cities of Germany have conferred it on you. It is therefore with joy that we have received the news of this event, which, as we trust, with the blessing of God on the efforts of your Majesty for the general good, will DRESS MATERIALS turn to the advantage not only of Ger many, but of all Europe. We return your Majesty, however, special thanks for the expression of your friendship for us, as we may hope that it will not inconsiderably contribute to the liberty and rights of the Catholic religion. On the other hand, we request your Majesty to be convinced that we shall neglect nothing by which, when the opportunity presents itself, we may be useful to your Majesty. In the meantime, we pray the Giver of all good things to richly vouchsafe to your Imperial and Royal Majesty all true hap-Imperial and Royal Majesty all true happiness, and unite you with us in the bonds of the most perfect affection. Given at Rome, St. Peter's (in the Vatican), on the 6th day of March, 1871. in the 25th year of our Pontificate. This letter, it will be remembered, was said to have given offence in France.
