Assistant Chief whip 1940; Chairman special committee of inquiry into war expenditures 1942. Secretary of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, Canadian Section 1944; Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Munitions and Supply 1943-45; Delegate, the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, Washington, 1943; Delegate, Bretton Woods Conference 1945; Chairman, the Canadian Delegation to the United Nations, Paris 1948; Hon. Colonel, S.D. 19, Highlanders 1956-61. Minister of Transport 1945-54; President of the St. Lawrence Seaway Authority 1954-57; President, The Privy Council 1957; elected member of the House of Commons for the constituency of Montreal-Laurier, 1957, 1958, 1962 and 1963; Minister of Justice and Attorney General for Canada 1963-1964; High Commissioner for Canada in the United Kingdom, 1964-1967; Chairman of the Commonwealth Committee on Sanctions against Rhodesia, London 1966-1967; Freeman of the City of London, 1964; Author "The St. Lawrence Seaway"; Ambassador and Commissioner General for Visits of State, 1967; Head of Special Mission to French African countries, 1968.
