Sat for North Wellington in L. A., Can., from 1859 to g. e., 1861. Returned to Commons, by acclamation Jan., 1869, for present seat on death of sitting mem. A Liberal and opposed to present Govt.—*Cumnock, Ont.*

ROSS, Hon. JOHN JONES, M. D. [*Champlain.*]

S. of G. McIntosh Ross, Esq., of St. Ames, formerly a West Indian merchant. B. at St. Ames. A physican and surgeon. Is a governor of the College of Physicians and Surgeons, L. C. Surgeon 1st Battalion Champlain Militia, and President of the Champlain Agricultural Society. Sat for present seat in L. A., Can., from g. e., 1861, until the Union, when returned to Commons and L. A., Quebec. Resigned his seat in the latter on his appointment to L. C. Quebec, 1867. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. E. Cartier.—*St. Anne de la Pêrade, P. Q.*
