

## Athletes-of-the-Month

A fifth year swimming veteran, Jackie Hatherly, and a first year volleyball rookie, Bryan Gauthier, have been honored as UNB's Female and Male Athletes-of-the-Month, respectively.

Jackie, 24 from Thunder Bay, Ontario, was honored twice as Female Athlete-of-the-Week during November. During the week of Nov. 1-6, the fifth year Political Science student won the 200m Individual Medley and the 200m Backstroke at the Dalhousie meet. The next day Jackie won the 100m Backstroke and was a member of the 800m Freestyle relay team. Two weeks later (Nov. 14-21) at the UNB Invitational Swim Meet, Jackie placed first in the 200m Individual Medley and the 200m Backstroke and second in the 100m Backstroke and 400m Individual Medley. Coach Bruce Fisher was very pleased with Jackie's pre-Christmas performance. Following a Florida

training trip over the holidays, Coach Fisher believes "Jackie's leadership, determination and courage will let her be a dominant factor when the AUAA's take place in February."

Bryan, 21, from MacMasterville, Quebec, was a key factor in leading the volleyball Rebels into a first place tie with league power Dalhousie before the Christmas break. Honored as UNB's Athlete-of-the-Week recently (Nov. 21-27), Bryan welcomes the Christmas holidays after a hard term. On Nov. 23, the second year Business student had 21 kills in UNB's 3-2 win over Moncton. During a week-end trip to Newfoundland, the first year player led UNB with 12 kills in a 3-0 win on Saturday and was the offensive star (13 kills) and defensive star in Sunday's 3-1 win over Memorial. Coach Paul Belanger welcomes the break and expects a great contribution from Bryan after the new year.
