

To the High Commission of the Dominion
Government now holding Treaty with the
Indians at Lac Du'Appelle the September
month A.D. 1874.

This the claim and memorial of
George Dasette - commonly known
as "Shamucam" sets forth and says

- 1st That for thirteen months service on
the Plains rendering efficient and
valuable service to the Government
the while furnishing his own horses
and being at all and every charge
he claims the sum of one hundred and sixty
dollars per month - making the sum of
two thousand and eighty dollars
- 2^{ndly} For certain services performed by him
in adjusting affairs with a Band of Sioux
whom he overtook at Beaver Creek
the sum of Two Hundred dollars:
- 3^{rdly} For an unadjusted claim for losses
incurred during the 'Rebellion' as it is
commonly known at Red River,
for special service rendered Col. Dennis,
for imprisonment and general
damage and injury arising from
his enforced flight and absence
from his farm and own proper
affairs - he claims the sum of fifteen
hundred dollars.

Collectively the whole sum of three
thousand seven hundred and eighty dollars
