	1st Mar.1943		Overcast. Snow flurries. Night flying washed out. NZ421535 LAC Roberts, A., overshot runway at Carp, Ontario, and nosed up Harvard BW199. No injury sustained. C-1 category. Flight Lieutenant Fummerton addressed the Officers in the Mess on Fighter Operations. C.B.C. broadcast of Mart Kenny and his orchestra, Judy Richards, Cy Mack, from the Recreation Hall at 8 o'clock. Mart and the orchestra played for Station personnel before the broadcast from 7.30 to 8, after eating supper in the Airmen's Mess.	
	2nd Mar.1943		Clear to partly cloudy. Normal flying day. Record night flying hours. 689 hours flying.	
	3rd Mar.1943		Clear. Normal flying day. 9:30 hours flying. Night flying.	
	4th Mar.1943		Clear. Normal day. Good flying. Special movie in the Recreation Hall.	
	5th Mar.1943		Snow flurries to partly cloudy. Commanding Officer's inspection on runways, preparatory to Deputy Inspector-General's parade. Snow blizzard came very quickly and broke up the parade. Weather cleared up but high winds remained. Normal flying day. Night flying.	
	6th Mar/43		Overcast to snow. High winds. Normal flying. Dull day. R151005 LAC Mitchell, F., taxied Harvard 3256 off taxi strip into deep snow puncturing starboard flap and main plane. Site of incident - Main Aerodrome. No injury. C-1 category. Blizzard Saturday afternoon.	
	7th Mar.1943		High overcast. Normal day - flying all day. Divine Services were held in the Recreation Hall this morning.	5
