Dear King, -

✓ Enclosed I am sending you my ideas as to the law which
would govern general elections if there were immediate dissolution
before any new legislation was passed.

✓ In doing so I cannot forbear to say one word on another
subject. I have read your speech of a week ago on the Treaty
with Bulgaria and see what you said favouring the suggestion of
getting power to amend the British North America Act by concurrent
action in Canada without resort to England at all.

✓ Speaking entirely for myself alone, I am sorry - I can
not help the feeling that anything of that sort makes for
separation - and seems like a step toward independence. It is
just the kind of thing Ewart and such men as agree with him will
be delighted with. For my part I look upon all these things

through the eyes of a U. E. Loyalist. A hundred years ago my
though struggling as country farmers might against the family Compact
grandfather, and his father, were burning with loyalty toward
King George personally - whether it was George III or George IV -
