4. What are the limitations of the right to use force in self-defence from an assault accompanied with insult.
5. What duty is laid upon a person who knows that treason is about to be committed by others?
6. Define the offence of perjury.
7. A. and B. bet \$100 that the result of a municipal contest then in progress will or will not be decided in any given manner. They each place \$100 in the hands of C. as stakeholder. What is the criminal liability of A., B. and C. respectively?
8. Distinguish *culpable* from *inculpable* homicide.
9. A. is B.'s factor. B. entrusts to A. certain goods for sale. B. is indebted to A. How far will A. be free from criminal liability if he pledges B.'s goods to C.?
10. A. and B. are accomplices with C. in a theft. C. hands some of the property to A. and then goes back into the same premises to steal more property. Before completion of the theft the parties are arrested. What are the offences of A., B. and C. respectively?
