Mr. MacNicol's questions concerning
Long Lake-Kenogami diversion.

1. House of Commons Debates, May 15, 1939, p.4334:-

"Long Lake Water Diversion — Proposed opening of Sluice Gates to carry pulpwood through international height of land — On the orders of the day:

"Mr. J.R. MacNicol (Davenport): I should like to ask the Prime Minister if anything further has taken place in reference to the Long Lake-Kenogami diversion following the letter of the Secretary of State of the United States of March 17, 1938, in which the United States declined to consider the Kenogami diversion alone.

"Right Hon. W.L. Mackenzie King (Prime Minister): I am unable to answer my hon. friend's question at the moment, but I shall try to see that an answer is given tomorrow."

2. This question by Mr. MacNicol was answered.
