MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRIME MINISTER:

C.B.C. report that to play over the record made yesterday even once would make it unsuitable for processing. They can, however, play over the one record which was first made and which has to be discarded. This would give the Prime Minister an idea of the general quality. The most satisfactory place to hear the record would be at the C.B.O. studio, because it cannot very well be played on an ordinary phonograph. The private stations will require some twelve records which is the reason that processing is necessary. It will take some days to have this work done, and an early release to them of the record in the hands of the C.B.C. is desired.
