
Madam: -

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of the quarterly returns of the Tobique day school covering the period taught by you during the current quarter. A cheque for \$9.26 is sent you herewith, being the balance due for your services as teacher during the present school year.

Payment is allowed for 34 days in the September Quarter, which includes three days you were absent at the Eucharistic Congress and one day, August 29th, taken to travel from your home to the school; for the current quarter you are allowed for 35 days, which includes Thanksgiving and All Saints Days.

You are, therefore, entitled to payment for 59 days; and as the regulations call for 216 teaching days during each school year, you are paid  $59/216$  of your salary of \$400.00, or the sum of \$109.26. You were paid \$100.00 at the end of the September quarter, and the enclosed cheque for \$9.26 is the balance of salary due for the period which you taught the Tobique school during the present school year.
