- Q. (Con't) you could obtain at home?
- A. I have a dress uniform.
- Q. That is described how on the list?
- A. Jackets Serge Drab woo, trousers serge drab. I have the sooks at home, woollen prs. (3), necktie, black (1), Brasses, button, (1), I have the towels, hand (1).
- Q. Is there anything else you would care to tell the court we haven't mentioned on this point, anything I have missed in the questions, any other point you want to tell the court?
- A. No. Sir.

CROSS-WAKINED BY THE PRODUCTOR

- Q. On the 29th of March 1944, were you stationed at No. 12 C.I.(B) T.C., Chatham?
- A. I am not sure of the date.
- Q. In March 1944 were you stationed at No. 15 C.I.(B) T.C., Chatham?
- A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. On the 29th of March 1944, did you so absent without leave from No. 12 6.1.(B) T.C.?
- A. No. Sir, I left from Chorley Park in Toronto.
- Q. Did you go absent on the 29th of March 1944?
- A. Yes, I did.
- Q. And did you remain absent until 2230 hrs. on the 6th of March, 1945?
- A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Here you apprehensed by the military authorities?
- A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Dressed in civilian clothes?
- A. Yes, Sir.
