Q.191 Is there anybody else that you know of who came in during the evening?

A.191 No.

Q.192 Did you dance with Mr. Corbett?

A.192 Yes Sir.

Q.193 About what time did you leave the Mess?

A.193 I don't remember Sir.

Q.194 Have you any idea of the approximate time?

A.194 I think it was about one o'clock.

Q.195 Whose idea was it that you should leave the Mess?

A.195 I don't really know, I suggested to Sedgwick that we should go home.

Q.196 Was it shortly after that suggestion that you did leave the Mess?

A.196 I think so.

Q.197 Will you tell us what happened when you left the Mess. Who did you go with or how you went?

A.197 Mr. Corbett and Col. Coombs and Sedgwick. We started to go back to Haxted House, we went a very short distance. Sir could you ask me questions?

Q.198 You suggested to Sedgwick that you go home and you say you think you left shortly after that?

A.198 Yes.

Q.199 Who went with you and Sedgwick from the Mess?

A.199 Mr. Corbett and Col. Coombs.

(The Prosecutor asks if the Court or the Defending Officer have any objections to this method of questioning the witness as it may appear that he is leading her. In view of the condition of the witness, neither object)

Q.200 Before you left the Mess do you remember if you were looking for anything?

A.200 Yes, we were looking for Pte. Sedgwick's hat.

Q.201 It was not found?

A.201 No.

Q.202 Then you, Sedgwick, Col. Coombs, and Mr. Corbett left the Mess and walked a short distance to where some cars were parked?

A.202 Yes.

Q.203 Did you all get in the same car or different cars?

A.203 The same car.

Q.204 Was it a War Department vehicle or a private car?
