

Train Service For Settlers

The attention of intending settlers is called to the fast and satisfactory service of the Canadian Pacific Railway to all points in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, and particularly to the following special arrangements made for settlers going West in the Spring of 1910. The train service is divided into two classes:—

1st. Special trains weekly as described below, for settlers taking West their live stock, quantities of household goods, farm implements, and general effects.

2nd. Daily service of fast passenger trains, carrying colonist cars and tourist sleepers, for settlers travelling alone and with their families.

SPECIAL for settlers travelling with live stock
TRAINS and effects will leave West Toronto at 11 p.m. every Tuesday during March and April, 1910, via the Canadian Pacific Railway "Muskoka Route."
