

PLATE III. THE ASYMMETRICAL SIDE.

Cephalothoracopagus monosymmetros cyclops synotus. On this side of the double foetus fusion has taken place at a somewhat acute angle, so that the two halves of the face (one of which has been derived from either foetus), have been reduced along the median line, a single eye (Cyclops), centrally placed, with the nasal proboscis displaced above it, and the ears approximated to each other beneath the chin. (Synotus, resulting.)
