

Second Lieutenant J. A. Williams: 7th Royal Irish Rifles.

Killed in Action at Ginchy, September, 1916, aged 18.

Lieutenant E. J. Williams: 1st Royal Irish Rifles (late of Bank of Montreal, Regina). Killed in Action near Courtrai, October, 1918, aged 26.

WILLIAMS, JOHN SMOUT—Captain. Born 7th July, 1886, at Scranton, Pennsylvania, U.S.A. Father, Rev. J. W. Williams, D.D., (deceased). Educated at Swansea Grammar School and Technical College. Entered the service of the Bank, 10th May, 1912. Enlisted, February, 1915, from Winnipeg branch, in 28th Canadian Battalion, with the rank of Lieutenant. Transferred to 6th Brigade, Stokes Gun Battery, March, 1916. Promoted Captain 6th October, 1916. Principal actions: St. Eloi, April, 1916; Third Battle of Ypres, June, 1916; Somme, September, 1916. Invalided to England—trench fever and influenza. 41, 46, 57, 105, 117, 136, 227, 249.

WILLIAMS, JOHN WARREN—Private. Born 19th November, 1896, at Craighurst, Ontario, Canada. Father, John Williams, Farmer (retired). Educated at Yellowgrass High School. Entered the service of the Bank, 12th August, 1915. Enlisted, 9th March, 1916, from Yellowgrass branch, in 152nd Canadian Battalion, with the rank of Private. Transferred to 32nd Reserve Battalion (England), November, 1916; 1st Canadian Entrenching Battalion, November, 1916; 5th Canadian Battalion (France), 13th April, 1917. Principal actions: Fresnoy, April, 1917; Amiens, 8th August, 1918. Wounded (gun shot), in the back, 8th August, 1918. Demobilized, 29th May, 1919. Returned to duty with the Bank, 17th December, 1919.

WILLIAMS, VINCENT—Company Sergeant-Major. Born 17th February, 1894, at Ahmedabad, India. Father, Rev. Thomas James Williams, Clerk in Holy Orders. Educated at St. John's, Leatherhead, and St. Peter's, York, England. Entered the service of the Bank, 27th January, 1914. Enlisted, February, 1915, in 5th Canadian Mounted Rifles, but owing to disability caused by an accident, was discharged, April, 1915. Re-enlisted, 24th January, 1916, from Beebe branch, in 117th (Eastern Townships) Battalion, with the rank of Private. Transferred to 23rd Reserve Battalion, January, 1917; 24th Canadian Battalion, February, 1917; Composite Company, June, 1917. Promoted Sergeant, March, 1916; Company Sergeant-Major, August, 1918. Principal action: Vimy Ridge, 1917. Invalided—trench fever—April, 1917. Demobilized, 24th April, 1919. Returned to duty with the Bank, 25th April, 1919.
