"And you help me to be strong?"

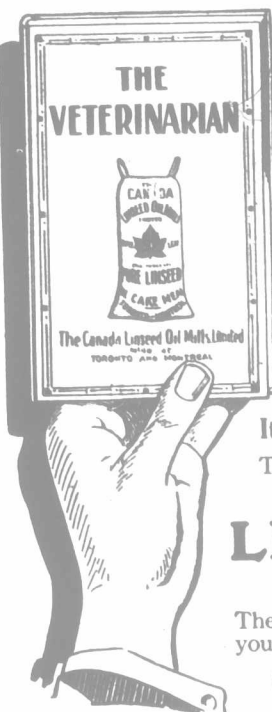
"With all my might."
