GOSSIP.

At the dispersion sale of the Short-horn herd of Mr. G. T. King, near Bristol, England, on October 17th, 82 head were sold for the splendid average of \$175. The 100-guinea mark was reached in three instances, namely, for the bull, Lord Bruce, and for the cows, Anemone 32nd and Countess 62nd, the latter being purchased by the agent of His Majesty King Edward VII.

Pine Grove stock farm, in the County of Oxford, three miles north of Goble's station, on the G. T. R., is the property of Mr. James M. Arthur, breeder of Shorthorn cattle. The herd at present numbers forty-five head of the Gwynne, Duchess of Clarence, Languish and Rosena families, at the head of which is the grandly-bred and splendidly-formed stock bull, Imp. Spicy Count, bred by William Anderson, Saphock, Aberdeenshire; sired by Spicy King; dam Countess of Balmoral 4th, by Velvet Jacket. His predecessor in the herd was Robert Bruce 31030, by New Year's Gift 22254, by Imp. Rantin Robin; dam Fanny B 81st 28894, by King of Wales 14657. Former stock bulls were Sultan Salem (imp.), bred by Cruickshank, sire Cumberland; Kinellar 19524, by Ingram 14272; and Imp. Sirius, bred by Duthie. The Gwynne family is represented by Flossy Gwynne 14th 25797, by 16th Duke of Hillsdale; dam Flossy Gwynne 8th (imp.). The Languish family by Molly Languish, by Plato 18827; dam Mary Languish 22124, by Waterloo Duke 18th. The Duchess of Clarence tribe by Pine Grove Duchess of Clarence, by Plato; dam Duchess of Clarence 36th. The Rosenas by Red Rose of Pine Grove, sired by Imp. Sultan Salem; dam Iran Topsy 2nd. This herd is a good representative one of the present-day type of Shorthorn, and contains a large number of really excellent animals, among which are a number of heifers of various ages, thick, blocky models that should develop into crackers. There are, also, about fifteen young bulls from six to twenty-four months old, among which can be picked out some A1 animals.

PIONEER STUD FARM.

The Pioneer Stud farm, of Bushnell, Ill., whose advertisement of Shire, Percheron, Suffolk and Hackney stallions runs in this paper, has recently received its fifth importation for this season. Among the lot are four Shire stallions from the Blaisdon stud, including the champion yearling, Blaisdon Harold 2nd. He is sired by the noted horse Blaisdon Harold (17776), and his dam, Hawthorn 16758, has produced other notable horses.

Blaisdon Albert (19350) is a two-year-old, from the same stud. He is a beautiful chestnut, with a grand set of legs, two good ends, and a middle and loin that leaves nothing to be desired, and, with his extraordinary action, classes him among the greatest horses of his age ever seen in this or any other country. This colt is a son of Blaisdon Conqueror (15989), acknowledged to be one of the greatest sires in the history of Shire breeding.

The Trumans tried hard to get Mr. Stubbs, the owner, to part with him, but their offer of \$15,000 was refused. Another two-year-old that Mr. Stubbs supplied is the bay, Blaisdon Farmer (19353). Here, again, we find breeding of the highest quality, being sired by Blaisdon Conqueror (15989) dam Wild Rose 17620, by Pluto (5262), the sire of Blaisdon Pluto, the champion and gold medal winner at the last International show held in Chicago.

Blaisdon Cardinal (18527) is a three-year-old, a big, wide, sappy colt, with all the style and action possible to get and one we are sure to hear of later on in his new home. He is a full brother of the champion yearling, Blaisdon Harold 2nd.

In the black two-year-old Grandford Hermit (19661) the Pioneer Stud farm looks for big things. This colt is a grandson of the great London winner, Harold (3703) on his sire's side, and Wonder of the West (2371) on his dam's side. Such a coupling of blood cannot help but have the desired effect. He is a perfect specimen of the breed, full of quality, and a remarkably good all-round goer. Passing on to the older horses, we may mention the seven-year-old, Rokety Fitz (16361), a horse that has done duty in the stud in England under the personal supervision of H. H. Truman, M. P., C. V. S., and has proved himself a sure and good breeder.

Duke X (17951), Ratchy Cashier (16856), Prince Shapely (16328), Ganier (18031), Dunsmore Heirloom (16655), Bury Ruler (17222), and several others (too numerous to mention, are all of the big, massive type and weigh a ton or better. The Percherons, with few exceptions, are blacks and fully up to the standard, and were bought from the best breeders in the Perche district of France. In age, they range from yearlings to seven-year-olds. In the lot is the great four-year-old, Dagobert (46970), Sirdar (43625), of the same age. Cachucha (45203) is a three-year-old that pulls the scales at 2,100 lbs. All are of the wide, short-legged sort so much sought after by American breeders.

The farm's reputation for importing Hackneys is fully sustained in this shipment. The Trumans have been handling the breed for some twenty-four years. They are bays, chestnuts and blue roans, standing sixteen hands, perfect conformation and extraordinary knee action.
