Mr. Stewart moved that Mr. Thomas Sims, late Under Sheriff, and Mr. Coun Douly Rankin, be notified to appear at the Bar of this House to-morrow. Ordered accordingly.

Mr. Hodgson from the Committee appointed to confer with a Committee of his Majesty's Council on the subject of the amendments proposed by them to the Bill to revive and perpetuate "an Act intituled an Act to enable the Justices of the Supreme Court of Judicature to issue Commissions for examining witnesses out of this Island," reported, That his Majesty's Council adhered to the amendments proposed to the said Bill.

Mr. Cameron moved that the said Bill do pass with the amendments. Ordered accordingly, and that the same be re-engrossed and sent up to his Majesty's Council—the title of which Bill stands as follows :

A Bill to revive and continue an Act intituled "an Act to enable the Justices of the Supreme Court of Judicature to issue Commissions for examining witnesses out of this Island."
