ALLISON DEBATE THE LAST OF MARCH

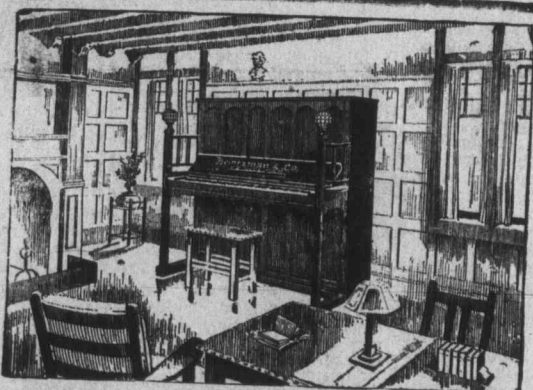
