ADDITION TO DEBT.

The revenue, expenditure and debt accounts for the fiscal year 1905-06 are not yet closed. Most of the revenue applicable to the year ending last June has been collected but many accounts are yet to be paid. The Canada Gazette gives the returns so far as they could be made up at the end of July.

During July \$1,001,225 was collected on the previous year's revenue, making a total of \$79,007,824 for the year. Last year the amount collected after July on account of the year before was \$233,565. If the same amount comes in this year the revenue for 1905-06 will be \$79,240,000. Mr. Fielding's budget estimate was \$79,000,000.

During July the sum of \$5,863,344 was expended on account of the past year, bringing the current expenditure up to \$59,924,869. This is still well short of Mr. Fielding's estimate of \$66,500,000. But the deferred payments made after July last year were \$7,299,357, and if the same amount is added this year the total will be \$67,224,205. Mr. Fielding expected to spend \$3,180,000 more in 1905-06 than in the previous year. But he is at present \$3,904,000 beyond that sum. This is current account.

The Finance Minister expected to spend \$15,500,000 on capital account, or the same as the previous year. He has spent down to the end of July \$13,797,293, and last year after July he paid \$3,510,000. The same payments this year will bring capital expenditure up to \$17,300,000. Mr. Fielding is now \$1,827,000 deeper than he was this time last year.

According to Mr. Fielding's budget figures the increase of net debt in the fiscal year, then nearly closed, would be \$800,000. But he said he was hopeful that the revenue would cover all expenditure so that nothing would be added to public debt. It is evident that this hope is vain. The net debt reported July 1st, 1906, was \$3,457,000 more than twelve months before. On the first of August the adjustments still left the debt \$2,528,000 larger than it was at the same date last year.

PAID TO VOTE.

Witnesses Swear They Got Money to Support Fielding.

Liverpool, N. S., Aug. 16.—The court trying the election petition against Hon. W. S. Fielding, yesterday morning, decided to let the question that the court had no jurisdiction on the ground that the date for the trial had been set beyond the legal time, be heard before the Supreme Court of Canada.

The first witness was John Wolfe of Western Head. He said that ex-Mayor D. C. Mulhall gave him a five-dollar bill to coax him to vote for Fielding or remain away from the polls.

The next witness swore that Mulhall asked him to vote for Fielding. He said quite likely he would. The ex-mayor then said, "I will give you \$5 if you do." He promised to do so, and received the \$5 and went to the polls and voted.

John Hanson said ex-Mayor Mulhall gave him \$5 to vote for Fielding. He received the money, and went to the polls and voted.

James Mulhall said he called at John Wolfe's house the night before the election. He saw Wolfe's wife, but would not swear whether he paid her \$5 or not. He said his mind on these election matters was a complete and absolute blank.

Thomas Craig said Harbor-master Dexter drove him to the polls, and afterwards told him to put his hand in his pocket and he would and something. He did so, and found \$5.

Roscoe Hall said he was in Dexter's employ, and he asked him to vote for Fielding, and told him if he did so he would find a present in his office. He went there, and found an envelope containing \$5. He then went and voted for Fielding.

The manager of the Union Bank, E. R. Mulhall, brother of the ex-mayor, said he did all he could for Fielding at the late election. When asked if he paid Stephen Strangler any money, he replied he was getting on in years, and could not remember recent occurrences.

CONSERVATIVE CONVENTION.

Hon. F. W. Haultain Wants to See it Held in Winnipeg.

Winnipeg, Aug. 16.—Hon. F. W. Haultain, who was here yesterday, in the course of a long statement, said: "The conservative party will have to take place in the policy and tactics of the conservative party if success were obtained and better government brought about in the Dominion.
