BLACK FLAG

Planted on Pike's Peak by Some Suffragettes.

Colorado Springs, Col., Nov. 6.—Accompanied by six suffragettes from Denver, Mrs. Helen Rein Baker, of Spokane, Wash., an ardent suffragette, yesterday planted a black flag on the summit of Pike's Peak. The banner was made by Mrs. Oliver H. P. Belmont, of New York, and bears the inscription, "Votes for Women." It was sent to Mrs. Baker by the leaders of the suffragette movement in New York. Mrs. Baker, who was one of the American delegates to the International Conference of Women in London last year, chartered a special train to the top of the peak.

RAILROAD SHOPS BURNED. Newburn, N. C., Nov. 6.—Fire that swept the shops of the Norfolk & Southern Railroad Company, here, at 2 o'clock this morning, resulted in a half million dollars' property loss. All of the buildings except the paint department were burned to the ground. A number of locomotives were also destroyed. The origin of the fire is not known.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may constitute a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency of the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon cultivation of the land for each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. In certain conditions a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of available land, six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and acquire fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted the homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emptive right may purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

HOW HE DID IT.

Hired Man Tells of Triple Murder in Saskatchewan.

Quill Lake, Sask., Nov. 5.—Calmy, and apparently with little realization of the enormity of his offence, John Melch, the Galician, told the magistrate how he killed George Thoburn, Mrs. Thoburn, and her mother, Mrs. McNeiven, formerly of Sarnia and Orillia, Ont., on their lonely homestead near this place last Monday. "I was away last Sunday to Mr. Bert Lake's. When I went home I was telling Mr. Thoburn I believed I would go up to Quill Lake before it froze up. I wanted to go to Quill Lake to file a claim on a home on Monday. I stayed at the home of Mr. Thoburn. He angered me, and when I went to prevent my going away I shot him. I fired both barrels at him at different times. This happened before breakfast, and the women locked themselves in the house. I hid in the stable and watched the house for any of them coming out. "At dinner time Mrs. Thoburn got out of the house and started to run. I got on a horse and followed her. I left her body west of the house in the edge of the scrub, about 300 yards away. Mrs. McNeiven came out of the house and said, 'Where are you, John?' and she went back again, and after a while she came out and started to walk away. I knocked her down with the barrel of the shotgun. I am not sure whether I hit her. I left her body about 200 yards northwest of the house, in the same scrub. Mary, the little girl, and George, the boy, were alone in the house when I left. After the sun went down I ran away with Thoburn's democrat and a feed of
