SUFFRAGETTES' REVOLT DUE TO MAN'S STUPIDITY

Henry Dalby Speaking in Montreal Declared that Women Are Fighting the Battle of the Human Race and that the Opposite Sex Has Driven Them To It.

Montreal, Nov. 24.—A comprehensive address on the question of women's suffrage was delivered before the St. James Literary Society last night by Mr. Henry Dalby.

"Let us examine what has brought the suffragettes into conflict with the police with such dire results to themselves, and what the reasons are for the immediate cause is that they have asserted as a constitutional principle their right to approach the King through his Ministers with a statement of their grievances, a right which has been recognized by the King.

"My impression is that if any British Government had ever undertaken to deal in a proper sense and natural way with the suffragettes, it would have had more than a revolt to deal with. It would have had a revolution on its hands.

"The Franchise Question

"To understand the true significance of the suffragette movement we must go back beyond the revolt which has brought these ladies into front, to the time when the franchise was first given to women.
