ANCIENT REGIME WILL PASS INTO HISTORY AFTER CHINESE NEW YEAR. Peking, Dec. 8.—It seems safe to announce tonight that the ancient absolute regime in China will exist only historically after the Chinese New Year, in January, 1911. It is stated that the throne has decided to accede to the resolution of the Imperial Senate, praying for the immediate creation of a constitutional cabinet.

The reported compliance of the throne is regarded as a compromise. The Senate will not wait for an immediate parliament, but proposes to conduct the government on a single chamber basis until 1913. It is understood the Venerable Prince Ching, of Boxer memory, the present power behind the throne, will resign his post. His Asai will become prime minister.
