

The Imperial Government in Pekin has sent orders to all generals in command of Imperial troops that they are to resume hostilities on January newed. It is assumed here that this step has been taken as the result of refusal by the revolutionaries to continue negotiations with the Pekin authorities by telegraph, in accordance with the demand by Yuan Shi Kai. The fact that the Premier is now possession of a considerable sum of money for the purpose of repressing the rebellion, and with which he can pay the Imperial troops, has, it is believed, inspired him with fresh confidence in his power to check the revolution, as he is aware that the Republicans lack resources.


