





Their Navy Re- mains Invisible.

(From the New York Times.)
It was only the other day that the
Kaiser eloquently eulogized the fidel-
ity and efficiency of his navy—the
navy he so accurately described as
"victorious." How strange it is,
therefore, as was noted in one of yester-
day's dispatches, that his victorious
navy has remained quietly at anchor
while the Allied forces moved along
the Belgian coast and occupied the
ports that were rightly held by the
Kaiser to be among the most precious
of his new possessions. To defend
those ports would be the natural task
of a victorious German navy, and one
that such a navy could hardly neglect
without making somewhat dubious its
right to that characterization. The
mystery, however, is not quite inex-
plicable. Now, as all through the war
the British Navy insists that it is "in
being," and knowledge of that fact
lingers in the German mind and forms
a cruel obstacle to the entering up-
on nautical adventures and enter-
prises. That is what the Germans
mean when they complain that the
seas have not been free in the past,
and demand that they be free in the
future.

Unsinkable Ship U-boats Victim.

New York, Oct. 19.—The American
steamship Lucia, equipped with buoy-
ancy boxes and supposed to be un-
sinkable, has been sunk, according to
word received here to-day in shipping
circles. She was torpedoed by a sub-
marine in the Atlantic.
The Lucia, formerly an Austrian
freighter of the same name, left an
Atlantic port with cargo on October
12. The vessel, taken over at Mobile,
Ala., when the United States entered
the war, was equipped at a cost of
more than \$200,000 with an "unsink-
able" device approved by naval offi-
cials for experimental purposes.
The device, its inventor declared,
would keep the ship afloat no matter
how much water was taken in through
holes torn in her side by torpedoes
or shell fire.
The freighter had made several
trips without accident, and the sub-
marine attack which sent her to the
bottom was the first attempt to sink
her.
The Lucia, a vessel of 744 tons
gross, was built in Austria in 1912, and
plied between Austrian and American
gulf ports in the cotton trade before
the war.



