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Fenian Movements.

The Globe's Ottawa correspondent under date Oct. 17th says:—I have special information confirming my statement of the shipment of Fenian arms at Potsdam, thirty-six miles from Ogdensburg. The arms are those seized by the American Government in 1861 and taken to Sackett's Harbor. They were lately restored to Fenian agents there.

The Hamilton Times says:—It is probable there will be a lively time over Railway affairs at the meeting of the two Legislatures. The Hon. I. Buchanan has given notice of an application to Parliament for a charter for building the Great Southern Railway.

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A singular case is pending in one of the police courts of New York city. A woman claims that a man, who is defendant in the case, is her husband. It is said that her two children look like him; her sister identifies him; his name is confessed to be the same as her own, and the woman herself swears positively that she was married to her eleven years ago, in Montreal, and is the father of her children. On the other hand, the defendant stoutly protests that he does not know the woman or the children; that he never was in Montreal, and brings witnesses to prove that he was in Norway at the time the marriage is alleged to have taken place in Montreal. The judge has not yet been able to decide the disputed question.
